

Cover Crop Cost-Share



Already using cover crops? Want to start using cover crops or plant more acres?

- Receive \$10 or \$12 / acre on up to 240 acres
- · Acres can overlap with any publicly funded cost-share program!



Cover Crop enrollment will start on August 15th for new applicants. Farmers will have the option of a \$10 or \$12/ac payment rate. This program is stackable with federal and state cost share programs.
